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

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

Jeff Gustavson, Vice President of the Mid-Continent business unit, is the head of Chevron's U.S. shale oil production. Specifically, he is leading Chevron's efforts in West Texas' Permian Basin where Chevron will dedicate nearly half of its U.S. exploration and production spending in 2019. In a short period, Chevron and Exxon Mobil have overcome most of the leading independent producers to take over at the top in the Permian. In Q3 2019, Chevron saw its Permian production surge 80% from the prior year to about 340,000 barrels/day. Gustvason moved to Houston earlier this year from Calgary to take over the Mid-Continent position after previously heading Chevron Canada. He is a Colorado native and University of Texas graduate who was raised in the oil industry.



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
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
